Your 2024–2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. In this process, New York Tech’s Office of Financial Aid will be comparing information from your FAFSA with copies of your (and your spouse’s or parents’) tax information as provided by the IRS. The law states that we have the right to ask you for this information before awarding federal aid (CFR 668.51). If there are differences between your FAFSA data and other requested documents, you or New York Tech may need to make corrections.

1. Please **complete, sign, and return** this worksheet, along with any other documentation requested by the Office of Financial Aid.
2. As part of federal student aid eligibility, students, spouses (if applicable) and parents will be required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2022 income information that was transferred into the student’s FAFSA using income and tax information directly from the IRS. If the 2022 income tax return information for the student, spouse (if applicable), and parent was not available or could not be used, you must submit a Tax Return Transcript or a signed copy of the 2022 income tax return and applicable schedules, and all W-2 forms associated with that information.
3. Please submit the transcript to New York Tech’s Office of Financial Aid with your full name and student ID clearly marked on each page. If the 2022 income tax return information was not or could not be used, and you are unable to obtain a Tax Return Transcript, you may submit a signed copy of the 2022 income tax return and all applicable schedules, and W-2 forms.
