

## Online M.B.A. Program for D.O. Students

There is no doubt that today's health care industry is extraordinarily complex, and few medical professionals are prepared with a complete understanding of everyday business practices within the industry—ranging from important policy and technology trends to finance and economic management principles. New York Institute of Technology's online M.B.A. with a concentration in health care management provides NYITCOM students with the necessary foundational business acumen to ensure the success of their future medical practice or health care organization.

**To complete the program, students will take a maximum of 48 credits (if students have already satisfied requirements through previous coursework, CLEP or DSST, some courses may be waived). The M.B.A. includes courses in accounting, marketing distribution, business analytics, operations and supply chain management, and leadership, which equips students with the skills and knowledge to make well-informed business decisions and enhance:**

- Basic Business Expertise: helpful for those planning to work in small/private practices.
- Management Skills: necessary for keeping teams and operations running smoothly.
- Technical Knowledge/Business Analytics: critical as technology continues to play an ever-increasing role in health care. For example, physicians in organizations of all sizes are required to use electronic health records and other information technology systems.
- Leadership Acumen: critical for those pursuing administrative roles in large medical organizations, the program uses an interdisciplinary approach to problem solving and management.

## M.B.A. Curriculum

The M.B.A. program offers a flexible, 100 percent online schedule that has been designed so that the M.B.A. classes do not conflict with the NYITCOM course schedule. Students begin their M.B.A. in the summer between the first and second year of their D.O. program. In their fourth year, they complete 3 elective credits in fall and 9 in the spring relating to health care management.

## How to Apply

1. Complete an application ([nyit.edu/admissions/how\\_to\\_apply\\_graduate](https://nyit.edu/admissions/how_to_apply_graduate)) and use fee waiver code DOMBA.
2. Email [rvillong@nyit.edu](mailto:rvillong@nyit.edu) to request an NYITCOM Concurrent Program–Academic Approval Form. This allows NYITCOM to release your undergraduate and graduate (if applicable) transcripts to our Graduate Admissions department.
3. After review of your transcripts, you will be informed of waivable (prerequisite) courses that will be required.
4. Upon successful completion of NYITCOM Year 1, the NYITCOM Committee for Academic Standards will approve the NYITCOM Concurrent Program–Academic Approval Form, and the Graduate Admissions department will send you an M.B.A. program letter of acceptance.
