 - C. Papers based on five assignments throughout the semester.
 - D. Reflection Paper. Write a 500-word report about their experience detailing what they learned during their internship experience. They can structure their reflection paper based on the following questions.

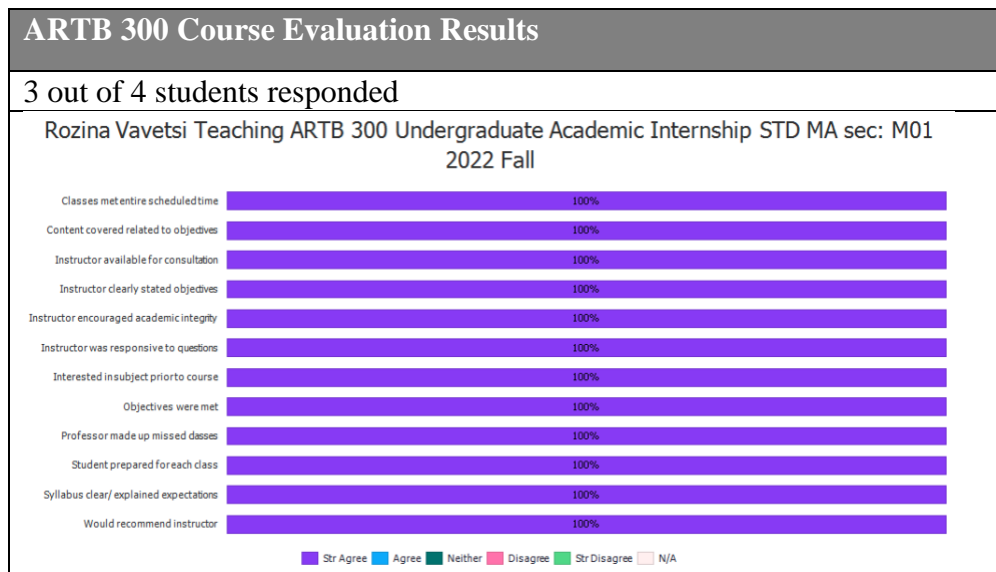

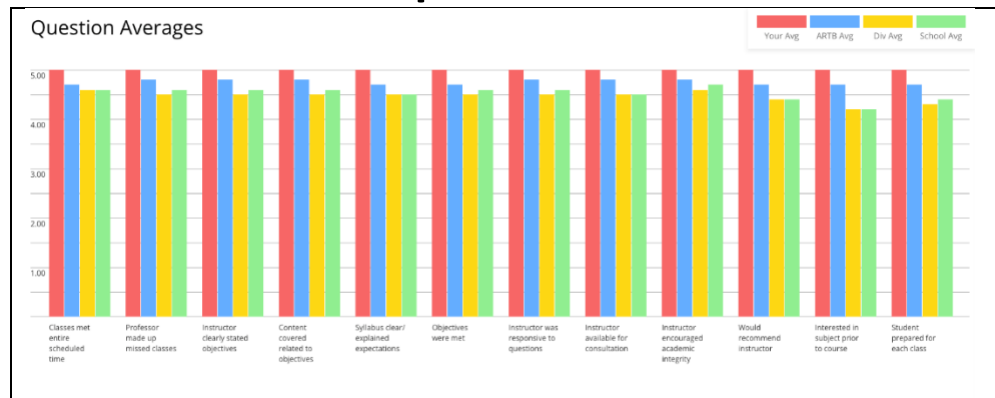

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4. INTERPRETATION: to what degree did students achieve the program learning outcomes based on your data analysis and expected learning outcomes?
- A. By the end of the semester students were able to:
- Describe and be exposed to a professional workflow in their industry.
 - Demonstrate the ability to work with others and under the direction of a supervisor on client-based design projects.
 - Articulate and improve the skills which they developed during the internship
 - Identify areas for further improvement in one’s skills, knowledge, and attitudes necessary for creative industry work environments.
 - Create business documents (LinkedIn/resume etc) that can be used for further professional development and networking.
- B. For the 2022-2023 year, all students in the course have passed with excellent grades.
- C. In the final evaluation, a comprehensive 100% of students demonstrated a clear recognition of the robust alignment between the course content and the designated course objectives. Furthermore, an unanimous 100% of students exhibited strong concurrence with the achieved objectives.



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5. CLOSE THE LOOP – If the expected program learning outcomes were successfully met, describe how the program will keep or expand the good practices, if not, refine or create the next cycle of PDSA
 - A. Students could pursue more demanding and committed internships in their field of knowledge and obtain more leadership roles.
 - B. The primary focus will be on resolving a fundamental issue: the standardization of Methods of Assessment and Grading Formula/Rubric for all DAD courses. This will enable consistent data collection, review, and performance enhancement each semester. This transparency will reduce student confusion and enhance the grading system.
 - C. In FA22/SP23, a misalignment was observed between the assessment plan and the method of assessment, particularly concerning the uniformity of rubric systems, evaluation methods, and survey models.
 - D. Moving forward into the FA23/SP24 period, the central emphasis will be on addressing a core challenge: the establishment of standardized Methods of Assessment and Grading Formula/Rubric. This approach will facilitate consistent data gathering, evaluation, and performance enhancement in every semester. This increased transparency will alleviate student confusion and elevate the grading system.
